Key takeaways



Nearly 1 in 4 Virginia residents live in an HOA.



Virginia would *not* be the first state to pass a similar law supporting HOA conservation landscaping.



Virginia is seeing a trend in weirder, wetter weather, bringing excess stormwater, which causes economic impacts.



Managed conservation landscaping is not just beautiful, it's practical and can help us meet our clean water goals and enhance biodiversity, and ultimately saving Virginia money.



HOA residents need legislative support to allow them to pursue conservation landscaping projects on their private property.
